OLIVER'S FIFTH

A 6 x 32 bar reel for 2 couples in a three couple set.

First couple cast off behind their own side of the set and dance down for four
steps, look at their partner and cast back up to the top finishing in original
places.

- Bars 9-16 First and second couples dance **four hands across** with right hands and back with the left.
- Bars 17-24 First couple **turn with the right hand for two steps and cast off one place**, second couple move up on three and four.

 The first couple then **turn with the left hand** for four steps and finish in second place.
- Bars 25-32 The first and second couples then dance **four hands round and back**, first couple ready to start again from second place.

Teaching Note:-

This is a simple dance that involves nothing more than **Skip-Change-of-Step** for bars 1 to 24 and **Slip Step** for the circle at the end.
